The meeting was called to order by Camp Commander Jeff Smith at 2:05 PM

The meeting minutes from February 21, 2016 were read by Secretary Greg Kline. Motion to accept by Brother Gene Mascioli, 2nd by Brother Bill Kuhn, motion approved.

Treasurer's report was read by Brother Dave Demmy, Sr. the checkbook balance of \$3100 was reported of which \$1800 will be paid out in Department and National per capita. Motion to accept by Brother Tom Bowman, second by Brother Tony Kline. Motion approved.

Brother Greg Kline gave an update on the possibility of a joint field trip with Camp 503 to the GAR museum in Scranton. Due to a few potential date conflicts with both Campos, a Saturday, May 21 meeting was suggested. Brother Kline will follow up with Camp 8 in Scranton to see if this is acceptable.

New Business:

Brother Dave Klinepeter made a motion to donate \$100 to support the upcoming Harrisburg Civil War Days. Brother Dave will generously be matching this contribution with an additional \$100.

Patriotic Instructor:

Brother Klinepeter made available brochures for the 43rd Annual GBPA Relic Show. He mentioned that the National Civil War Museum at Harrisburg, has earned Harrisburg Magazine's Reader's Choice Award. TripAdvisor also gives the museum high marks and calls it one of the best Civil War museums in the nation.

Dave mentioned some important March historical dates including the 1912 founding of the Girl Scouts of America and March 3, 1931 when the Star Spangled Banner was made the National Anthem by Act of Congress.

Dave reminded the Camp of the upcoming March 26 ceremony at Soldier's & Sailor's Grove to honor Pennsylvania recipients of the Medal of Honor.

I kinda hated to cut it but it was delicious, and there was some left over which was taken care of the next day. I suspect the fire marshal suggested they not light up 90 candles so they came up with two numbers which were easier to blow out. Thanks Brothers, it was greatly appreciated. djk

I forgot to list a special date in last month's newsletter.

"FOR CONSPICIOUS GALLENTRY AND INTREPIDITY IN ACTION AT THE RISK OF LIFE ABOVE AND BEYOND THE CALL OF DUTY."

<u>March 25, 1863</u>--Secretary of War Stanton presented the MEDAL OF HONOR for the first time to 6 of "Anderson's Raiders" (from the great locomotive chase during the Civil War.) Pennsylvania had 378 Medals of Honor awarded for Civil war action, only second to New York. A number of them were not awarded till the 1890s when a review of actions and records were reviewed. Many medals were taken back by the government, at that time. One woman, Dr Mary Edward Walker, a civilian, was awarded the medal. She refused to return the medal to the government.

<u>March 26, 2016</u> A Medal of Honor Day Commemoration service was held at the Soldier's Grove, Capitol Complex, in Harrisburg, Pa.

The program was sponsored by the Vietnam Veterans of America Novosel Chapter 542 and the Special Forces Association. [SFC Randall Shugart] Chapter 64, in conjunction with the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. I was in attendance. It was quite impressive, a beautiful day, the only thing missing was the public. Mostly veterans, family and a few friends were there. It seems a problem leaving the public know about events coming up. I understand this program is to be an annual event. djk







Larry Chester Sheibley-Beasom

1947 - 2016 Obituary Condolences



Larry C. Sheibley-Beasom, 68 years old, of Newport, passed away Friday, April 8, 2016. Larry was born August 6, 1947 to the late Chester F. and Mary (Beasom) Sheibley. He was a 1965 graduate of Newport High School, where he was a member of the National Honor Society, 1969 graduate of Shippensburg University with a B.S. in Mathematics and Spanish, 1973 and 1975 graduate of West Chester University with a M.Ed. in Instructional Media Education and Secondary Education and 2008 graduate of Charles W. Howard Santa Claus School. He was a retired middle school mathematics teacher in the West Chester Area School District from September 1969 - June 1999. During those thirty years, at various times, he taught 6, 7, 8, and 9 at East School, North Junior, Fugett Middle, Gifted Education Center, and Stetson Middle. At Fugett, he was a Mathematics

Department Chairman and team leader. He co-authored Computer Literacy Success Kit published in 1984 by J. Weston Walch Publishers, Portland, ME. *He was a volunteer in the Emergency Room at Brandywine Hospital and Trauma Center, Coatesville, Pa. 1995-2002, volunteer math and ESL tutor for the Perry County Literacy Council and volunteer GED and ESL tutor at the Perry County Prison*. He traveled to all 7 continents, over 140 countries and all 50 states. He was a speaker at local, state, and national mathematics conventions and since 2008, annually sponsored 3 scholarships to Newport High School Graduating Seniors.

Larry was a member of the Newport First Church of God, Newport Lodge #381 F&AM, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite: Valley of Harrisburg, Newport Royal Arch Chapter #238, Sons of the American Revolution: Halifax Chapter (secretary), **Sons of the Union Veterans of the Civil War: Gen. John F. Hartranft Camp 15** (**past company commander, secretary**), Perry Historians: life member, Historical Society of Perry County: life member, and Juniata County Historical Society: life member.

Larry is survived by a large, loving family and many friends.

Services for Larry will be held from the David Myers Funeral Home, Walnut Street, Newport with a viewing on Friday from 6-8 PM and on Saturday from 10 AM until the funeral service at 11 AM with the Reverend Cheryl Dorman, Reverend Trevor Lightner and Pastor Rodney Bower officiating. Burial will follow in the Bloomfield Cemetery, New Bloomfield.
