## PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN

Have you heard of "Readshaw's Raiders"? On March 21, 2017, I (as Governor Curtin) brother Larry Keener Farley and wife, Annette, were invited to the House of Representatives in Harrisburg, PA, for the reading of a House Resolution. (I will only print part of it) A Resolution recognizing the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Gettysburg Monuments Project was founded on April 20, 1997.

A reprinted *Baltimore Sun* news article in the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* served as the catalyst for the project. Pennsylvania Representative Harry Readshaw (from the Pittsburgh area) established a group of preservationist, fondly called "Readshaw's Raiders". Hundreds of thousands of dollars have been raised for the repairs and upkeep of the 146th Pennsylvania regimental monuments and

markers on the battlefield. This has been done by numerous contributors. The oldest battlefield preservation organization in the country provided nonprofit status. Thousands of school students, thousands of Civil War reenactors, companies, corporations, preservation groups, and individuals donated. To raise more money a commemorative Gettysburg license plate was produced, authors donated book proceeds, motorcycle rides held, Civil War Balls held and various other events. In the General Assembly approved 2014 Pennsylvania monument vehicle registration plate of which over 600 have been sold. Numerous people and organizations still support the "Readshaw Raiders" twenty years later. This is only a thumb nail sketch of the House Resolution. Brother Harry is a long-time brother of our Hartranft Camp 15!

On March 25, 2017 the 14th Annual Civil War Preservation Ball conducted by the Victorian Dance Ensemble, in the Rotunda of the Pennsylvania Capitol. All profits are given to the "Readshaw Raiders". By the way your Patriotic Instructor and brother Larry Keener Farley are founders of the Victorian Dance Ensemble.

Those who did not attend March meeting missed a very good talk by Dick Simpson. His subject was the Battle of Franklin, TN area. I for one never realized that such heavy action took place in those areas. Brother Dick is a member of the SUVCW too.

Did you know?

April 18, 1861 was the opening of Camp Curtin in Harrisburg, PA

May 11, 1864 Jeb Stuart was shot at Battle of Yellow Tavern, he died the next day.

Galusha Pennypacker of Pennsylvania was promoted to brigadier general before his twenty

first birthday. He was called the hero of Fort Fisher and was awarded the Medal of Honor.

Two U S presidents, Brev. Major William McKinley and Brev. Major General Rutherford B. Hayes served in the Twenty third Ohio during the Civil War.

Major Robert Anderson surrendered Fort Sumter on April 14, 1861 and raised the flag there again four years later Major General Philip Kearny when riding held the reins of the horse in his mouth because of a missing left arm.

Johnny Clem nine year old enrolled drummer received 13 dollars a month soldier pay. It was contributed by the officers and men of the Twenty second Michigan.
