#### **Heroes Grove Fund**

"Since its establishment in 1785, Dauphin County has been home to countless ordinary citizens who have accomplished extraordinary feats. All have had one common thread: A willingness to sacrifice their own safety and well-being to protect their fellow citizens and the American way of life. Now, more than 220 years later, a movement has begun to honor these brave heroes.

Conceived by the Hon. Ronald Marsico and a collection of dedicated public servants, civic and community leaders, the Dauphin County Heroes Grove is being developed on a peaceful tract of land donated by Lower Paxton Township. Dauphin County Heroes Grove will feature an amphitheater, which will set the stage for remembrance and memorial honor ceremonies that will veterans, emergency responders, and law enforcement personnel who have demonstrated their dedication to our communities, commonwealth, and country. The amphitheater will also be the setting for a series of educational seminars and festivals." Camp 15 is a sponsor of this veteran's project!

#### REMEMBERANCE DAY GETTYSBURG, PA. NOVEMBER 20, 2010 - THE PARADE

A beautiful clear, warm, sunny day. (some in the past were cold, wet, rainy, windy, sleet or snow flurries). I was unable to arrive in time for the Woolson Monument wreath laving services. (I do remember being on the Color Guard at the original dedication of the Woolson monument in 1956). I managed to find parking near the GAR Hall and walked over to the school were the troops were lining up. I can no longer march in the parade, so President Lincoln has invited me to share his carriage the last several years. This year we had the honor of Brad Schall- Commander in Chief of the Sons of Union Veterans riding with us. There was quite a turn out of people. At the end we stood and reviewed the parade. (this brought back many memories to me of many years ago. In the 1940s and 1950s the parade consisted of the 6 Infantry Field Music, Penna Brigade, Sons of Veterans Reserve--Fife and Drum Corps of Harrisburg, Pa, the school band of Gettysburg, Pa, a number of Sons of Veteran Reserve Units, and town folks. We marched from around the Train Station and Hotel Gettysburg out to the National Cemetery where wreaths were placed by the Allied Orders of the Grand Army of the Republic and speeches were delivered. This was before the Woolson monument and reenactors. The banquet in the evening was at the Hotel Gettysburg, There was no Civil War Ball in those days.) It is interesting to stand and review the parade and see the many various participants, not just the Union soldiers but the Marines, the Navy, the numerous Ladies organizations, the Confederates, the U.S. Colored Troops, the civilian units, especially the children involved. To keep our history alive we must involve the younger generations, for they are the future of our country. "YES I SAW BROTHER GREG KLINE PCC CARRYING OUR HARTRANFT CAMP 15 COLORS, 3 huzzzas to him. 

#### THE BANQUET

Before the meal I placed a small plastic bag containing 4 different 2009 Lincoln pennies and a new 2010 President Lincoln dollar, enclosed was a card with compliments of Hartranft Camp 15 for each guest at the head table .After the dinner and introduction of National Officers and State Officers of the Allied Orders of the Grand Army of the Republic, it was my pleasure to present our Sons of Union Veterans license plate to Commander in Chief Brad Schall. (That plate went to California.) Right before my presentation we heard a band in the adjoining room start playing Benny Goodman music. They were having a World War 11 dance. It was also a pleasure to have the speaker of the evening sitting at my table. He was Michael Cruther, Sr., portraying Fredrick Douglass. Mr. Crusher is an Army retiree and former assistant professor at the University of Kentucky's Lexington Community College. His current role was inspired after research revealed his great, great grandfather was a member of the 13th United States Colored Troops Heavy Artillery out of Camp Nelson, Kentucky. The talk was quite interesting. After our Penna closing and taps, the Ladies organizations opened up a side room and sold chances on various items and 50-50 tickets, to raise money.

(I did manage to drop in next door and hob nob with some of the WW11 folks. They, like us, are trying to teach and keep history alive.

My only disappointment, no other members of Camp 15 attended the banquet.

#### THE NATIONAL CIVIL WAR BALL

I understand over four hundred people were in attendance. There are several Balls around town but this is the oldest and largest one, it is sponsored by the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. This year I understand they raised approximately

\$4,500 which has been presented to the Gettysburg National Military Park. The Philadelphia Brigade Band, provided music for a variety of dances. The Victorian Dance Ensemble, under the leadership of Brother Larry Keener Farley PCC Camp 15, helped teach the dances and guide the dancers. (Your Patriotic Instructor was one of the organizers of the Victorian Dance Ensemble years ago) It is a sight to behold, the ladies in beautiful gowns, gentlemen in uniforms or civilian period attire. The Grand March was lead off by none other than our Commander-in Chief, Brad Schall. I did manage to participate in that march, and later on in a special waltz. It was a delight to see quite a number of young adults and some children on the dance floor. Another favorite of the evening was the Ladies cake walk. Col Bud Atkinson had them form in 4 circles and when the music stops some one won a cake or other door prize. During the evening a young lady tapped me on the shoulder and handed me an envelope. It seems I had won one of the 50-50 drawings (sorry I can not remember which ladies organization it was). Needless to say it paid for my banquet and ball tickets. The luck of the Irish--yes I know I'm German but my wife is Irish. During the early break I chatted with the Dept Commander of Illinois and he took one of our license plates along home. By than it was time to hit the road home.



# **DIRECTIONS**

From I-81, take exit 85B(northbound) or exit 85 (southbound), Fort Indiantown Gap exit, and proceed north on Route 934. At the first red light, turn right onto Service Road. The museum is located four tenths of a mile at the corner of Service Road and Wiley Road, Building T-8-57. Look for the Civil War Cannon, Korean era tank, and the museum signs on the right hand side.

Norman L. Houser, 71, of Halifax died Saturday, December 11, 2010 at Harrisburg Hospital. He was born March 27, 1939 in Harrisburg, a son of the late Walter and Ruth (Umholtz) Houser. Norman was in banking for 50 years and retired as Senior

Vice-president of Mid-Penn Bank. He received many awards and recognitions.
