<u>John Frederick Hartranft (1830-1889)</u> — Born in New Hanover Township, <u>Montgomery County</u>, Pa., <u>December 16, 1830</u>.

A Republican, he served in the Union Army during the Civil War; was Pennsylvania state auditor general, 1866-72; then Governor of Pennsylvania, 1873-79; and candidate for Republican nomination for President, 1876. He received the Medal of Honor in 1886 for action at Bull Run, Va., July 21, 1861. The General died October 17, 1889. His Interment is at Montgomery Cemetery, Norristown, PA. The General, of course, is our Camp's namesake!
