#### PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR by Dave Klinepeter

FEBRUARY 12, 1809 - FEBRUARY 12, 2009 -200TH ANNIVERSARY OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY. There were many programs and also numerous items to mark the bi-centennial. The Mint struck four new PENNIES denoting periods of Lincoln's life. (WHERE HAVE ALL THE PENNIES GONE?) I have hunted and watched for the different pennies through the year but to no avail. The mint is out of the proof sets, they have some of the pennies in rolls at high prices, also the coin dealers have them for special prices but the banks do not have them. I have asked at many banks and other places but most did not receive them. I wanted to give each member attending our February meeting a small bag with 4 Lincoln pennies each; guess that will not happen! The

mint now has a new Lincoln Silver Dollar available. DATES:

### GAR HISTORIAN by Dave Klinepeter

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC -- (THE FATHER ORGANIZATION OF THE SONS OF VETERANS):

The Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) was founded on April 6, 1866 at Decatur, Illinois by Major Benjamin F. Stephen, a surgeon, who served with the 14th Illinois Infantry.

The society was composed of men who were HONORABLY DISCHARGED UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR, having served between April 12, 1861 and April 9, 1865. As an organization the functions were to honor those who had died in the war, to provide for the orphan children and widows, to help the disabled and destitute veteran, to promote comradeship among veterans, and to uphold the Constitution and protect the American Flag at all cost. Their watchword was FRATERNITY, CHARITY AND LOYALTY. They were very strong in pension legislation for all veterans. A meeting was held on July 12, 1866 at Springfield, Illinois, which was attended by delegates from ten states, including Pennsylvania. A number of resolutions were presented and adopted, thus forming what would officially become known as the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR).

The first official encampment was held at Indianapolis, Indiana on November 20, 1866. General Stephen Hurlbut was elected the first Commander Chief 288 in bv delegates attending. In 1868. under the leadership of the second Commander in Chief. General John A. Logan, the famous General Order #11 was issued establishing May 30th as Decoration Day, later renamed Memorial Day. From then on May 30th was a very special day for those who had worn the Blue, fought and died in defense of National unity. The GAR floundered in its maiden years under the weight of politics. They contained members of both political parties and they clashed within the

ranks at every meeting or veterans gathering. membership kept declining until a The resolution was passed at the National Encampment in 1869 called for the elimination of any political debate at any National, State or Post function. The resolution was approved but it took almost ten years before the politics was silenced. After that the organization began to grow again. The Grand Army welded a very strong influence over the years. Up until 1901, with the death of President McKinley, six of the seven preceding presidents were veterans of the Civil War. In 1888 the Grand Army of the Republic recognized the Order of the Sons of Veterans (later renamed the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War). The report of 1889 dave a membership of 410.000 with 6711 Posts in 42 Departments. In June 1892 the membership peaked at 445,368 veterans. At Anniversary, the Silver the National Encampment was held in Washington D.C. Over 80,000 veterans marched in the Grand Parade, over the same route they did in the Grand Review in 1865. This period was undoubtedly the high mark of the Grand Army of the Republic with 7,568 Posts in existence. The GAR continued to hold encampments each year at different cities in various states, but by 1948 only 52 Union Veterans were living.

At the 83rd Encampment at Grand Rapids, Michigan it was decided the final encampment would be held at Indianapolis, Indiana in 1949. Fittingly they returned to the city where the first encampment was held in 1866. (Your Patriotic Instructor was in attendance at the final encampment of the GAR in 1949)! EDITOR'S NOTE: CAMP 15'S PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR WAS A VERY YOUNG WORLD WAR || NAVY VETERAN IN 1949. The GAR never opened its ranks to veterans of other wars, so it became a last-man club. The last member of the GAR was Albert Woolson of Duluth, Minnesota. He was also the last UNION VETERAN. Woolson was 109 years in age when he died on August 2, 1956. For over 90 years the GAR had been a reminder of the struggle to save the UNION. They never failed to remember Memorial Day. It is now up to us to continue in their footsteps. Sunday, 17 January 2010 Camp meeting called to order at 2:04 p.m.

Since our new commander, John Deppen, was not present at the Christmas party to be sworn in as a 2010 officer, 2009 Commander Gregory Kline opened the meeting and presented the commander's badge and gavel to Brother Deppen and a Military Service Medal to Brother Jack Rushoe who, also, missed the holiday party.

A letter from Brother Mascioli stated that he was willing to arrange a field trip to the Pennsylvania Civil War Battle Flags at the Capitol Preservation Committee facility on Market Street in Harrisburg. Camp 15 has visited the building twice in the past and will schedule another trip this year.

Brother Floyd Demmy stated that the PA Farm Show is in its 94<sup>th</sup> year and is planning a centennial anniversary book. Anyone with stories about this event should contact the PA Agriculture Department.

Patriotic Instructor Klinepeter stated that he was ready to make a GAR presentation to the camp but postponed to next month, hoping for a larger audience. His "coming attractions" appeared very interesting as usual! He mentioned the 22 January Harrisburg Civil War Round Table presentation, "House Divided", the 30 January Indiantown Gap Battle of the Bulge, and the 150<sup>th</sup> Civil War Anniversary road show trailers which will visit every PA county between 2011 and 2015. Because Dave missed the Christmas party, he had drawings for six patriotic prizes which he donated to the camp.

All members having Civil War artifacts or presentations are welcomed to speak at a future meeting. Brother Houser stated that he had 51 Civil War letters and would be willing to make a presentation.
