

It is with a heavy heart and deep regret that I report the passing of our Brother Arthur Lee Longnaker of Hartranft camp 15!

Brother Art is survived by Shirley H. (Marsh) Longnaker; a son, Arthur Lee Longnaker, Jr. his wife, Traci; a daughter, Marsha L. Eisenhauer and husband, Larry; and two grandchildren, Chase A. and Morgan D. Longnaker; and several nieces and nephews.

Brother Art was a proud U.S. Army Air Corps veteran having served during WWII. He graduated Air Craft and Engine Mechanic Technical School! He attained the rank of sergeant and served as Crew Chief and earned the American Service, Victory, and Good Conduct medals.

Art was recruited into Hartranft Camp 15 by his friend and our late Brother Gilbert Kyle. His membership was based upon his ancestor and grandfather, John C. Longneker [sic], Company C, 192d Regiment Pennsylvania Volunteers.

Interment will be at National Cemetery at Fort Indiantown Gap 5 February 2013.

As Commander, I am requesting that all membership badges and camp newsletter be draped in black until 4 March 2013 in remembrance of our late Brother Arthur Longnaker.

Also, this issue of the *Hartranft Herald* is draped in honor of the life of our late Brother National *Real Son* Walter Edward Roode, age 99. Brother Roode passed away on Saturday January 19, 2013. He was born in Belchertown, MA on June 8, 1913 the son of civil war veteran, Stephen Washington Roode and Mary (Peereboom) Roode. His father served with Co. K, 9th Vermont Infantry and was captured, paroled, and reenlisted with Co. B, 2nd Battalion, 17th U. S. Infantry. At present and according to National records, there are only 11 *known* surviving real sons of our grand organization, the SUVCW.


2013 DUES

Happy anniversary to General John F Hartranft, Camp 15 Harrisburg, PA, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War - Established February 11, 1882!

February 15, 1968 Harper's Weekly cartoon, Republican and Democratic "matrons" dote over the "baby," General Ulysses S. Grant, enticing him to talk about the public issues of the day, particularly Reconstruction and monetary policy. commanding general of the U.S. army, Grant was a central figure in Reconstruction due to the role federal troops played in enforcing Congressional policy. Grant's opinions were solicited not merely because of the influence he might have on federal policy, but because both parties were hoping to convince him to run for president. Leading Democrats, such as party chair August Belmont, wanted Grant to be their standard-bearer in 1868. Although the general had been a nominal Democrat, Republicans viewed him as a popular war-hero and someone who rose above partisan interests in both war and peace to battle for the common good. He was privately known to disagree with President Johnson, a Democrat, over Reconstruction and to support the agenda of moderate Republicans.

Grant supported Congressional Reconstruction against Johnson's more lenient policy. In May 1868, Republicans nominated Grant for president, and the Senate narrowly defeated the effort to remove Johnson from office after his impeachment. In November, Grant won the first of two presidential terms.

- 2. Brother Dave Demmy Sr reported that a brick for the walkway at the National Civil War Museum has been ordered and we want to delicate it at the April or May meetings. Secretary Greg Kline will work on a press release for the event and try to contact "Out and About with

- Chuck Rhodes" to try to obtain coverage from ABC27 as well.
- 3. JVC Jeff Smith announced that his daughter's middle school in Mechanicsburg will be having a Civil War night on Friday, May 17 and he is looking for participants.
- 4. JVC Jeff Smith suggested the possibility of a joint event between us and a Sons of Confederate Veterans chapter to correspond with the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg. He will be working up a letter to send to the SCV chapters. Camp 15 should explore the doing possibility of а **SUVCW** Sesquicentennial event although Brother Greg Kline brought up that the application process takes 90 days so the Camp will have to act quickly.
- 5. Brother Greg Kline reminded the membership that we again have a recruiting table reserved for the recruiting event to be held from 10AM-4PM, February 16 at the US Army Heritage Center in Carlisle. Volunteers are welcome.

Patriotic Instructor Dave Klinepeter started his program with an update on local Civil War history related events and speakers. He then discussed events which occurred in the month of January during the Civil War and gave examples from each year of the war including the Emancipation Proclamation. Brother Dave spoke about the witness trees at Gettysburg and where some of them are located. The new Camp gavel that Dave donated is made from one located at the Brickyard. There is now a program which allows people to buy seedlings generated by witness trees.

Brother Tony Kline inquired about the health of National Quartermaster Danny Wheeler. Who recently underwent surgery following a heartattack! Brother David Demmy Sr reported that he is recuperating and that it will be a while until the Quartermaster's office will be up and running again at full efficiency.

Encampment/Grand
Army/of the
Republic". Below this
are three more drops.
The second inscribed
"Boston

Massachusetts 1924". The third one is inscribed "Gaylord

Saltzgaber, Commander-in-Chief". the fourth is inscribed "Representative". Below that is the pendant which has a profile of Abraham Lincoln surrounded by a blue enameled ring inscribed "With Malice Toward None/With Charity For All". The reverse is blank except for the maker's mark "Robbins Co/Atteboro" on the lower pendant. --- Dave Klinepeter

Driving directions to Army Heritage Education Center at Carlisle

Directions:

FROM THE SOUTHWEST: Drive North on Interstate 81 to Exit 48 (York Road). At the bottom of the ramp, turn right. Continue to second stoplight and turn left onto Fairview Street. Proceed to next stoplight and turn right onto Army Heritage Drive. Proceed straight through the next stop light (intersection of Trindle Road and Army Heritage Drive). You will cross over Interstate 81. USAHEC is located on the left hand side of the road. If you proceed to the railroad tracks, you have gone too far.

FROM THE NORTHEAST AND NORTH: Go southwest on Interstate 81 to Exit 49. At the bottom of the ramp, turn left onto Trindle Road. At next stoplight, turn left at the light onto Army Heritage Drive. You will cross over Interstate 81. USAHEC is located on the left hand side of the road. If you proceed to the railroad tracks, you have gone too far.

FROM THE EAST OR WEST ON THE PA TURNPIKE: From the PA Turnpike take Exit 226 to Rt. 11 South. Continue on Rt. 11 South to the second traffic light, where Sheetz is located. At this traffic light, turn left onto Harmony Hall Road. Take next right onto Claremont Road. Take first left onto Army Heritage Drive. Continue over the railroad tracks, USAHEC is located on the right hand side of the road. If you proceed to the stoplight, you have gone too far.
