
Camp 15's next business meeting is scheduled for Sunday February 21 at 2pm – let us hope for dry weather for our Brothers that travel afar.



PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN by Dave Klinepeter

At the January Camp 15 meeting I mentioned that the Civil War News was ending. I was corrected by several members that the CWN Facebook stated they had changed their mind. Here is part of the comments:

"Dear CWN contributors"

Due to the overwhelming response from Civil War News subscribers, advertisers and readers, Jack Melton has decided to continue Civil War News in its current newspaper format instead of transitioning some of it into a new magazine. I will stay on an issue or two until he has support staff. As Jack has said "We value the opinions and input from the readers who have spoken loud and clear." The regular CWN departments and features will continue, along with some new ones. The Civil War community will have to respond with editorial contributions, subscriptions and ads if the CWN is to be The CWN website and Facebook will successful. continue as well. As I said a few weeks ago, I appreciate your past service to CWN and look forward to your future well. A good 2016 service as to all. Signed Kay Jorgensen.

Civil War News is a current events monthly newspaper published by Jack W. Melton Jr Historical Publications LLC., 6175 Hickory Flat Hwy Suite 110-355

Canton, Ga 30115 mail@civilwarnews.com. He also publishes The Artilleryman magazine.

The newspaper was founded in 1974 by Michael Cavanaugh in Philadelphia as the Civil War Book Exchange. (Your Patriotic Instructor was one of the first subscribers to it and still subscribe today, wish now I had kept those back issues.)

February is Black History Month

In the beginning of the Civil War black men tried to get into the military service but were not allowed. In the spring of 1861 free black men rushed to enlist but were turned away because Federal law banned Negroes from bearing arms for the U.S. Several generals tried to enlist them but it was revoked by the War Department. In

January of 1862 Fredrick Douglass visited Governor Andrew Curtin, in Harrisburg, Pa. trying to persuade Pennsylvania to recruit black soldiers. At that time the War Department was not taking black troops so the Governor refused. In March of 1863 the War Department gave permission to Governor Andrews of Mass. permission to raise colored troops.

In Pennsylvania, Thomas Morris Chester, of Harrisburg, Pa., a journalist, educator, and attorney, went recruiting in Penna. It is said, he paid their train fare to Mass for enlistment in the 54th Mass troops. In May 1863 the Government established the Bureau of Colored Troops. On June 1863 Governor Curtin opened Camp Penn at Chelton Hills. Pa. for colored troops. Over 11.000 men. 8600 from Pa, took training there. The camp was open till 1865. 25 colored men of both the Army and Navy receiver the Congressional Medal of Honor although some were not awarded till years later. In November 1865 there was a Grand Review of Colored Troops in Harrisburg, Pa. There were no Colored Troops in the big Grand Review in Washington D. C. There are two local colored cemeteries, I know of, one in the Steelton area, Midland Cemetery and in Susquehanna Township, Lincoln Cemetery. I have attended services in both. Midland holds Memorial Day services every year. I was on the honor guard at Lincoln for Ephraim Slaughter's funeral in 1943. He was the last Civil War veteran from Harrisburg, Pa.

There are many records and other material available for researching. djk

Brother Dave mentioned an article in the Harrisburg Patriot article featuring the Medal of Honor Memorial at Heroes Grove at the State Capitol. On March 26, there will be a program honoring Pennsylvania recipients. The meeting was closed by Commander Smith at 3:22 PM




