# PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN By Dave Klinepeter

Allow me tell you about a unique historical Civil War reenactment that I was involved in, on November 6, 2010 in Harrisburg, Pa. **First a little back ground history**. On May 23 and 24, 1865 in Washington D.C. a GRAND REVIEW of the victorious Union Army was held. For various reasons no colored troops participated. On November 14, 1865 in Harrisburg, Pa there was a Grand Review held for some returning United States Colored Troops (U.S.C.T.) This was arranged by the Garnet Equal Rights League. Harrisburg resident Thomas Morris Chester had worked as a war correspondent during the war was the chairman.

**November 6, 2010** was reenacting the 145th anniversary of the Grand Review in Harrisburg, Pa. There were a number of other events over several days but I was only involved on the 6th. At 8:30am in the Forum Building was held a Grand Review Blessing and Dedication service, than outside to form up the actual parade. Of course, I was dressed in my Victorian style outfit. It was



there I met Caleb Jackson, portraying Thomas Morris Chester, as Grand Marshal of the parade. (Caleb and I are long time retired postal employees) He explained to me why I had not been officially invited to portray Governor Andrew Curtin, The original Governor Curtin, for some unknown reason, did not participate. I explained to Caleb my not being able to walk in parades but would see him at the end at the capitol steps. He was in the third carriage and happened to have an empty seat, so I accepted the invitation. The parade




made a stop at the capitol steps on THIRD AND WALNUT STREETS where several people spoke and a band played, than on to the Simon Cameron mansion on south Front Street. (The original Colored Troops wanted to pay honor to Cameron because of his early support for Colored Troops while Secretary of the War)




The Simon Cameron portrayer read the original address. They than marched up Front St to State St and up to the Capitol steps and were greeted by Governor Rendell. I was greatly impressed with the parade. In the line of march were ,the Lincoln University Marching Band, the Cheney University Marching Band, the Gettysburg Fife and Drum Corps, a large delegation of Prince Hall Masons, over 100 reenactors from 10 states, direct descendants of U.S.C.Ts, various local high school and college students trained to portray soldiers, some carried banners with the names of Civil War Veterans, there was a hose cart and fire pumper of 1845 vintage, from the Harrisburg Fire Museum, pulled by students, Color Guards from several Veteran organizations, and several student and community groups, plus three carriages of dignitaries. I was delighted to ride along and think the whole parade was well organized, also a very good turn out of people to see it. This all took place in the morning.


