

Senior Vice-Commander Scott Debo began the meeting at 2:00 with the opening ceremonies. Secretary Larry Sheibley read the January minutes and Treasurer David Demmy, Sr., reported \$1881 in the camp account.

Secretary Sheibley reported the following: Camp 15 has an article in the PA newsletter, Battle Crv of Department Freedom; the Appomattox Luncheon is 21 April in Williamsport; and the PA Department Encampment, 21-23 June, will be held in Greensburg. Please see the Camp Secretary for a credentials card in order to attend this convention. Six Camp 15 brothers have unpaid 2012 dues. Second notices will be sent 21 February.

Junior Vice-Commander Jeff Smith is obtaining information on setting up a Camp 15

recruitment booth at the June and November Civil War gun shows in Gettysburg. Our camp had recruitment tables at the Harrisburg National Civil War Museum and the Carlisle Army Heritage Center on Saturday 18 February.

Camp 15 and Sunbury Camp 503 will be having a combined field trip Saturday 31 March to the Scranton GAR Post. Arranged by Joe Long of Scranton Lt. Ezra Griffin Camp #8, the luncheon will begin at 11:00 followed by a museum tour.

Tony Kline and Floyd Demmy asked about searching for Civil War ancestry. Rev. Logan Garth Swanger volunteered to design a genealogy worksheet. Lee Walters stated that Camp 15 owns a gun safe stored at his residence. Since we previously sold our rifles, the safe is empty and up for sale. Contact the camp if interested in the purchase.

Camp 15 welcomed visitor Bill Kimmich who heard about our organization at one of yesterday's recruitment tables. We hope he will is a future member.

After listing some February events, Patriotic Instructor Dave Klinepeter spoke of the Civil War Colored PA Troops which were originally trained in Massachusetts before a training program was established in our state. Harrisburg's GAR David Stephens Post 520 was chartered for colored veterans.

Brother Tony Kline spoke on the U.S. Coast Guard of which he was a member in the 1950's. The service began in 1790 as the U.S. Revenue Marines and changed in 1863 to the Revenue Cutter Service. Using a poster display to back-up his talk, he noted historical dates, light houses, duties, and cutter ships. The Harriet Lane was three successive cutters named after President James Buchanan's niece. The Coast Guard Academy opened in 1876 in New Bedford, MA, and later moved

to New London, CT. On behalf of the eighteen people present, thanks for the information, display, and presentation! This was another great oration by a Camp 15 brother.

The March meeting will be on the second floor of the National Civil War Museum with an outside presentation by Cooper's Battery. Dress warmly, possibly.

PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR and GAR HISTORIAN by Dave Klinepeter

I have been surprised at the amount of material and information generated over the 150th anniversary of the Civil War. I am sure it will continue into 1865 and the end of the war. In a way this is good. For years, many of us tried to encourage the younger generations to learn about our country's history (which lacks teaching in school). Over the years, movies such as Killer Angels, Glory, Ken Burn's Civil War, also writers, researchers, and especially reenactors have been able to stimulate some peoples interest in our history and also if they may have had an ancestor who helped preserve the UNION. Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War need to recruit some of these people to keep us growing and to help preserve the past.

The 150th of the Civil War is now in the second year 1862. On Jan 18, 2012 the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg, PA., had a reception to preview a new exhibit in honor of the Civil War Sesquicentennial 1862. Dana Shoaf, editor of the Civil War Times magazine gave an interesting speech on the of 1862 and crucial year how the Confederates had the potential to win the war. The new exhibit is located on the 1st floor gallery next to the Lincoln exhibit.

SPECIAL DATES

1861 March 4th Abraham Lincoln is inaugurated 16th President of the United States.

1862 March 7th Battle of Pea Ridge in Arkansas Confederates badly beaten.

March 9th Battle of the Monitor and the CSS Virginia off Hampton Roads VA.

March 17th US Treasury introduces paper money called "GREENBACKS'.

March 28th Battle of Glorieta Pass, New Mexico. Union troops won.


1863 March 3rd Congress passes the Conscription Act Americas first war time draft covered males age 20 to 45.

1864 March 1st US Grant is given Supreme Commander of all Union forces and promoted to Lieutenant General a rank previous attained only by George Washington. March 12th The Union launched the disastrous Red River campaign.

1865 March 31st Fighting at White Oak Road begins the final offensive of the Civil War. The next day is the Battle of Five Forks causing General Lee to evacuate Richmond and Petersburg, VA. ---- DJK



Artillery Orders of 1865

Regulations for Batteries.

Head-Quarters Department of the Cumberland, Chattanooga, Tenn., January 20, 1865.

GENERAL ORDERS, No. 4.

All Batteries serving in the Field with the moveable Army, will have two (2) additional caissons to each Battery, retained at Artillery Brigade Head-Quarters.

Five hundred (500) rounds per gun will be the minimum amount of ammunition for all Batteries serving in the Field, except the Cavalry, which will be three hundred (300).

Eight (8) mounted Batteries will compose the Light Artillery Reserve for the Infantry, and two horse Batteries for the Cavalry, to be selected by the Chief of Artillery, of the Department, and stationed at Chattanooga.

All surplus Batteries belonging to the Army of the Cumberland, and not a part of the Garrison Artillery, will be dismounted, (guns turned into the Ordnance Department at Nashville), and sent to Chattanooga for duty at that Post.

At a Fire Fighting Training school they demonstrate this with a deep fat fryer set on the fire field. An instructor would don a fire suit and using an 8-oz. cup at the end of a 10-foot pole to toss water onto the grease fire.

The results got the attention of the students. The water, being heavier than oil, sinks to the bottom where it instantly becomes superheated.

The explosive force of the steam blows the burning oil up and out. On the open field, it became a thirty-foot high fireball that resembled a nuclear blast. Inside the confines of a kitchen, the fire ball hits the ceiling and fills the entire room. Also, do not throw sugar or flour on a grease fire. One-cup of either creates the explosive force of two sticks of dynamite.




