

Mother's Day was born thanks to Philadelphia citizen Anna Jarvis on May 8, 1914, when President Woodrow Wilson appointed the second Sunday in May for the holiday. Jarvis led an eleven-year campaign to have a holiday to honor the memory of her mother and mothers everywhere! May's second Sunday was chosen because that was the day, Jarvis' mother died on, in 1905. The carnation was chosen as the customary flower because Jarvis' mother's garden was full of them.

# PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR by Dave Klinepeter (The Cyclorama building is no more)

In the middle of the month of March, I was in Gettysburg and decided to check out the progress on the removal of the old Cyclorama building. It was about half way taken down.



See photo above. They are cleaning the last of the rubble out and will be seeding it before this summer. For some reason the building was built right in the fishhook of the Union defense line of the Battle of Gettysburg... It opened in 1962 as the National Park Headquarters and visitors center, a year before the 100th anniversary of the battle. Others and I were opposed to putting it in that

Others and I were opposed to putting it in that location, others wanted it there and they won that battle.

The Cyclorama painting of Pickett's Charge was removed, restored, and placed in the new National Park Visitors Center in 2008. A lawsuit developed between those wanting to keep the building there and the National Park Service to remove it. This time the Park Service won. The Park has a longrange plan to return the battlefield to as much of the original appearance as possible. Power lines have been buried, trees have been removed, original style fences installed, crops planted, peach orchard planted.

Numerous volunteers and organizations have been helping with manpower and money to accomplish this goal. Each year the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War hold a Civil War Ball the weekend of Remembrance Day and all the profits are given to the National Park at Gettysburg to use on any project.

MEMORIAL DAY MEMORIES OF HARTRANFT
CAMP 15 SUVCW

One of the most important days of the Grand Army of the Republic was May 30. On May 5, 1868 General Logan, Commander-in Chief of the GAR issued his order Number 11 designating May 30 as a time to decorate the graves of fallen comrades. This observance continued for many years and than the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War took up the torch.

Leave me take you back to the 1940s and 1950s and tell how things were planned for Memorial Day in Camp 15. Approximately six months before the special day our own Major John H. Runkle (Past National Commander in Chief of the Sons of Union Veterans) would attend meetings with committee's in Penbrook, Progress, Paxtang, Enola, West Fairview and The War Veterans Council in Harrisburg. Flags and grave markers were ordered from the Dauphin County Commissioners

Letterkenny Army Depot provided .45-70 blank cartridges! We would receive over 2,800 American flags to place on graves in 14 cemeteries -- some large, most were small.

The Sunday before Memorial Day, we always attended church in a group, accompanied by the

ladies organizations. Every year the service was held in a different Harrisburg church.

After the services, there was a **parade** in the Penbrook-Progress area. The Sons of Union Veterans Fife and Drum Corps lead the parade followed by Company G Sons of Veterans Reserves Rifle Squad.

It ended at East Harrisburg Cemetery where a service was held followed by **firing a salute** and taps.

Memorial Day, May 30, not [the] changed date, the big parade was in Harrisburg, Pa. in the morning. In front of our Fife and Drum Corps, Camp Color Guard, and Company G Rifle Squad marched members of Camp 15.

Two of them carried an arrangement of Carnations. It had a blue border, white field and a red GAR in the center. This was placed on the cemetery Soldiers Plot. We held a full service than. A guest speaker, General Logan's Order # 11 was read by the Camp Commander, followed by the reading of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address by a high school senior. This was followed by the firing of salutes and taps in three different locations.

After the Harrisburg parade and services we went to **Reservoir Park**, where the Auxiliary had prepared lunch. We were joined by the Camp and Rifle Company from Middletown, Pa for the rest of the day. Following lunch, every one loaded up and went to Paxtang for a short parade and services at the Paxtang Cemetery. This parade always had a group of schoolchildren with fresh cut flowers for the Veterans graves. After that the Company and Drum Corp split up in small groups and headed for 10 different cemeteries to fire a salute and sound taps.

The Sunday after Memorial Day we went to West Fairview-Enola for their parade. Again, there were

services, firing a salute and taps. At all these parades the local Veterans organizations participated with us.

This gives you an idea what it was like in those long gone days.

The meeting was called to order by SVC Smith at 2:10 PM.

Minutes from the March meeting were read by Brother Tony Kline, in the absence of Secretary Greg Kline. Motion to accept by Brother Lee Walters, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Brother David Demmy, Sr. Motion approved.

Treasurer David Demmy, Sr. did not have a complete treasurer's report, however he said that there is approximately \$450.00 in the treasury. David reported on the Texas Roadhouse fundraiser and said that the certificates that were turned in for Camp #15 credit have been sent to the Texas Roadhouse auditor in Texas and it will be some time before we will receive a check. Brother Tony Kline read C-in-C Perley Mellor's General Order #19 where several changes to the National staff were announced!

#### **Old Business**

1) Gettysburg 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Event. SVC Jeff Smith reported that Leslie Culp Camp #1961 of Gettysburg responded to our invitation, but declined to participate because they have too many other activities at that time. He did not get any response from the James Longstreet Camp #1247 of Richmond, Virginia. He may send an invitation to some other SCV camp in Maryland, but is not very optimistic that our proposed events will take place.

#### 2) Patriotic Instructor

Using a poster board display to back-up his talk, SVC Jeff Smith gave a cavalry presentation as it existed at the time of the Civil War. He described the differences as to how the South differed from the North regarding selection of horses and mules and the availability and use of weaponry. Jeff displayed several rifles and a sword that the cavalry would have used. In addition, he talked about the Cavalry Generals that were involved in the battle of Gettysburg, including Generals Pleasanton, Buford, Gregg and Kilpatrick. The talk was very interesting and informative.

After the closing ritual ceremony, the meeting ended at 3:35 PM. The next meeting will be held Sunday, May 19, 2013 at 2:00 PM.



If the back room is open, we shall use that space due to the number of Brothers enjoying fully cooked breakfast of their choice! Queries are invited.




