Mother's Day was born thanks to Philadelphia citizen Anna Jarvis on May 8, 1914, when President Woodrow Wilson appointed the second Sunday in May for the holiday. Jarvis led an eleven-year campaign to have a holiday to honor the memory of her mother and mothers everywhere. May's second Sunday was chosen because that was the day, Jarvis' mother died on, in 1905. The carnation was chosen as the customary flower because Jarvis' mother's garden was full of them. ARLINGTON AT 150

PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN

MEMORIAL DAY THIS YEAR WILL BE ON MONDAY MAY 26, 2014.

Back in June 28, 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Holiday bill moving Memorial Day to the third week end of May.(I believe this was done to help the tourist) We the Sons of Union Veterans and other organizations have tried to have it moved back to May 30th , but with no avail. The largest group, after the Civil War, to set a date for Memorial Day was the Grand Army of the Republic with their Commander in Chief, General John A. Logan reading his order #11 setting aside the 30th day of May, 1868 for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, and hamlet churchyard in the land. This date continued on May 30th for many years. It is now only fitting we remember all veterans of our country who have died.

For information and many pictures of Hartranft Camp 15 participation in Memorial Day activities over the years past go to our web site we are still active. See other information in this newsletter. I have been invited to attend the services at Midland Cemetery, Steelton Pa. on May 24, hope to go to Indiantown Gap on May 25, and have been invited to ride in the carriage with President Lincoln on May 26 Gettysburg for their Memorial Day parade to the National Cemetery

On April 3rd I went to the World War 11 Roundtable in Hummelstown, Pa. To me it was a special event, our own brother Floyd Demmy gave us a talk on his service. He sure did a lot of walking around in Europe. People were quite interested, after the meeting a number came up asking questions and posing for pictures. Like most veterans, he came home, got married and raised a family. Of course we all know his number one son, David Demmy, Sr. Camp 15 Chaplain, Camp Treasurer and National Executive Director, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. Brother Floyd Demmy, will be offering a talk on his life during WWII with the 10th Armored Division, General Patton's Third Army at our May 18th Camp meeting! Arlington National Cemetery is hosting a series of events to commemorate its 150 anniversary. ANC 150 will begin on May 13 with a wreath laying ceremony at the gravesite of Army Private William Cristman, the first burial at Arlington, and conclude with a wreath laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknowns on June 15, the day Arlington officially became a national cemetery. The cemetery will also offer lectures and tours highlighting U.S. history through the eyes of heroes buried at Arlington and the military conflicts that shaped the cemetery and the nation.

Floyd Demmy, April 2014 Speaker at Central Pennsylvania World War II Roundtable meeting.

On Thursday, April 3, six Brothers of Camp 15 explored a different facet of American history and attended a meeting of the Greater Harrisburg World War II Roundtable in Hummelstown. The featured speaker that evening was none other than Camp 15's own Brother Floyd Demmy! Brother Floyd held the audience of at least 150 people in the palm of his hand as he told the tales of his adventures with the 10th Armored Division, [Patton's Third Army] in Europe during World War II.

I've often believed that the best and most interesting way to teach history is by telling stories and Floyd is a master story-teller. He not only presented the facts of his unit's wartime history but sprinkled in enough *personal and humorous details* to keep everyone wishing the program would last all night. From shipping out aboard the Aquitania (sister ship to the famous Lusitania) to narrowly missing being re-deployed to the Pacific



Theater after Germany's surrender, Floyd impressed everyone with his amazing recall of his honorable service to our country. I truly hope that we can persuade him to do the same for us soon at a Camp meeting!

Of all the wonderful moments that the evening provided, one that I remember best is seeing a young boy of around 10 years of age, [Dylan Kriner of Palmyra], shown above, who was hanging on every word that Floyd spoke and couldn't wait to pose for photos with him after the program. Floyd added one more piece to his service to our country that night by passing along his story to the next generation. The boy left the meeting that night with not only a deserved pride in his country but a better knowledge of the men and women who helped to make it great. Thank you, Brother Floyd.

So often we are encouraged, especially around patriotic holidays, to "thank a veteran". We may want to start at our next Camp meeting. Just look around the room—there are plenty to choose from.
