Have you ever been close enough to a tank to feel the ground rumble beneath your feet? Or watch as it crashes through what looks to be an impenetrable terrain, taking out anything in its path? The U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center (USAHEC) in Carlisle, PA is making your dreams come true, May 20 and 21, 2017. This year's Army Heritage Days will highlight the *100th Anniversary of the Armored Corps* by filling the *Army Heritage* <u>Trail</u> with armored vehicles, past and present.

From a WWI Armored Car to an M1 tank of today's Army, each armored vehicle will be manned by living historians who will bring to life the stories of the Soldiers who once made these armored vehicles their home. In addition to the static displays, the USAHEC is creating its own tank course for these historic vehicles to run on.

Army Heritage Days is a timeline living history event about U.S. Army history and the American Soldier. The event will take place on the Army Heritage Trail and USAHEC and will run both days from 9AM to 5PM. As always, the weekend-long event will feature lectures by well-known historians or Army leaders, military equipment displays, tactics and weapons demonstrations, and a meet and greet session with U.S. Army veterans. This familyfriendly event will also have *many children's activities* including a passport program, which allows children to travel back through time and claim a prize. You won't even have to be worried about paying for entry, as the entire experience is free for all visitors! 





PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN by Dave Klinepeter

At the April meeting of our Hartranft Camp 15 my talk was about April 6, 1917. It is the official 100th anniversary of the United States of America entering WW1. After my talk, Commander Smith invited other members to tell if they knew someone who had served during WW1. Of course, May is always *Memorial Day* Remembrance. This year it is on May 29th. We remember those veterans who have passed away, in some places with parades and cemetery ceremonies, in November we remember and honor ALL veterans for their services. In following through with the WW1 theme, I am reprinting part of the May 31, 1917 Telegraph News, MEMORIAL DAY SOLEMN WITH NATION AT WAR. Even Greater Tribute Paid Those Who Died In Defense Of U. S.: G.A.R. Veterans Are Given Wonderful Ovation In Parade: City Mourns as Bells Are Tolled.

Never since the observance of Memorial Day began far back in 1868 has the day meant so much to both young and old in the United States, as this great country is rapidly completing it's preparations for active participation in the war. Today as the veterans of the historic Civil War filed down the city streets to the cemeteries to pay tribute to their departed comrades, it was evident that the ceremonies were the most somber, yet the most impressive ever observed in the city. With a deeper and truer meaning a new vision came today to the younger generations as they saw before them, the Boys in Blue, living examples of patriotism and loyalty to the flag. The presence of the war scarred veterans, with bent shoulder, dimmed eye and grayed head, filled the young men and young women with more pronounced and more sincere love of country and a greater patriotic devotion to the flag. During the day circulars were handed out on the street by the Grand Army men, bearing this charge: "Young men, your country needs you. The boys of '61-65' present you THE FLAG unsullied, keep it so. Don't be a slacker, but enlist in some branch of the service". Compliments of the Patriotic Instructor of Post 58 G.A.R.

LEAVES STRONG IMPRESSION But this year the wonderful devotion of the old soldiers for the comrade who have answered the call of Death, left an impression which will be more lasting than ever before. Each year since 1868 the Boys in Blue formed a line, than with large numbers in the ranks, and marched to the burial grounds, posted the flags and strewed the flowers and returned home. Each year the numbers grew smaller, but the men, even as they grew more aged, never failed the tryst to honor the comrade who had gone before. Today but a mere handful remain. In 1865 thousands marched down Pennsylvania Ave in Washington for the final review, went to their homes and received an honorable discharge. In the morning G.A.R. Post 58 went to East Harrisburg Cemetery on Herr Street, and G.A.R. Post 116 went to Paxtang Cemetery on Paxtang Avenue.

Cheers for the Past and Present

The parade formed at Front and Market Street, moved off at 2 pm Crowds lined the streets traversed by the veterans and cheered the Boys in Blue and the Boys in Olive Drab in the National Guard companies. (next is listed the units of the first division, mostly National Guard, other veteran organizations. The second division consisted of the G.A.R. Post, *Sons of Union Veterans*, autos with veterans and speakers) At 13th and State Streets, members of the Colored G.A.R. Post 520 left for Lincoln Cemetery and G.A.R. Post 58, and G.A.R. Post 116 with the *Sons of Union Veterans* proceeded to the Harrisburg Cemetery for services.

Note because of length I have not listed the names of the units in the parade or the list of people involved in the cemetery ceremonies The last two Civil War veterans in Harrisburg to attend Memorial Day services were John Barton and Ephraim Slaughter, both of Colored G.A.R, Post 520 I will have a newspaper clipping from May 31, 1939 at the May meeting showing both men at the Harrisburg cemetery for the memorial services.

Our National Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War website offers you the opportunity to post your Civil War ancestor(s) photo (and story) on our National website:

The *Photos from the Past* web page was initiated by Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) Past Commander-in-Chief Keith G. Harrison, then National Webmaster, in February 1998, as a means for the

members of the SUVCW and other Allied Orders of the Grand Army of the Republic, and the general public to honor and preserve the memory of the men who preserved the Union 1861 - 1865. Since then, the popularity of the page and the number of veterans listed has continued to grow.

Anyone who has photographs of their Civil War ancestor either during the Civil War or after, or photographs relating to the post Civil War veterans' organization, the Grand Army of the Republic, is welcomed to <u>electronically</u> submit them along with accompanying identification to the <u>Backup National</u> SUVCW Webmaster for inclusion on that page.

Important Notice: Large graphics (photograph) bitmap (bmp) files (100,000 bytes and larger) CANNOT BE ACCEPTED as they monopolize the recipient's email program in terms of downloading. If you have a large bmp file, you will need to obtain access to a graphics program and first reduce the size of the file and then save (convert) it to a JPG. File or gif format before sending. Your graphics file that you submit should not be any larger than 30,000 bytes.

The meeting was called to order by Camp Commander Jeff Smith at 2:02 PM

The meeting minutes from March 19, 2017 were read by Secretary Greg Kline. Motion to accept by Brother David Demmy, Sr, 2nd by Brother Dave Klinepeter, motion approved.

Treasurer's report was read by Brother David Demmy, Sr. A checkbook balance of \$1300 was reported. Brother David discussed the fact that 6 Brothers had unpaid dues as of March 31 and will be dropped from the Camp Membership rolls. Secretary Kline spoke about the process that is used by the Camp to inform Brothers of delinquent dues, Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report by Brother

Camp 15 received a letter from Camp# 34 Brother Dick Simpson (last month's speaker) stating that he has made a donation on behalf of Camp 15 for \$100 to the Save the Franklin Battlefield fund.

Unfinished Business:

We still need to confirm the May 6 date for the filming of the GAR meeting reenactment in Philadelphia.

Brother Dave Klinepeter passed out an itinerary for the **Harrisburg Civil War Days** to be held from June 16-18. Camp 15 will have a recruiting table at the National Civil War Museum on Free Day 17th!

Adopt-a-Position: Commander Smith announced that the Spring work party will be held on Saturday, May 13 and we will meet first for lunch at O'Rourke's on Steinwehr Avenue at 11:30. Secretary Kline will send out a Dispatch to the Camp.

New Business:

Brother David Klinepeter made a motion to run a full page ad for Camp# 15 in this year's Department Encampment booklet. 2nd by Brother Greg Kline, motion approved.

Good of the Order:

Brother Greg Kline discussed his recent visit to the GAR Hall in Johnstown with Brother Tony Kline and Camp 503 Chaplain Dot Kline. Brother Randy Beisel of Johnstown offered to provide future tours for anyone interested and could also include a visit to the Johnstown Flood museum and the Flight 93 Memorial.

Patriotic Instructor:

Patriotic Instructor Dave Klinepeter mentioned April & May dates of historic significance including the anniversary of the April 9th surrender of General Robert E. Lee to General Ulysses S. Grant which again coincided with Palm Sunday, as it did at the time of the Civil War. He also mentioned POW Recognition Day on April 9, the May 7, 1945 surrender of German forces in WWII and Armed Forces Day on May 20.

Dave brought up the upcoming Army Heritage Day in Carlisle on May 20 for anyone interested in attending. This will highlight the 100th anniversary of the Armored Corps and will feature period equipment, reenactor demonstrations lectures and a meet and greet with veterans. The event hours are 9-5.

The meeting was closed by Commander Smith at 3:37 PM
