

The United States Flag Code 36s 176(k) states: "The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem of display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning."

If you need hard copy of the service, ask *Hartranft Herald* staff.

## GENERAL JOHN F HARTRANFT, CAMP 15 HARRISBURG, PA,

SONS OF UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR ESTABLISHED FEBRUARY 11, 1882 IN FRATERNITY, CHARITY, AND LOYALTY A death notice Monday November 7, 2011– Mrs. Gloria Klinepeter lost the long fight against her infirmity and is now at peace!

A message from immediate past camp Commander Greg Kline:

"I didn't have the privilege of knowing Gloria well but have had the pleasure of knowing Dave for the past 8 years in the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Camp 15 of Harrisburg. He is a true gentleman and a living legend in Civil War circles. Dave is best known for his portrayal of Governor Curtin but was also one of the founding fathers of the hobby we all love. He was a founding member of Knapp's Battery dating back to the late 1950's. He is a founding member of the Victorian Dance Ensemble, a nearly 70 year member of the Sons of Union Veterans and a member of numerous other historical and collecting societies.

Dave was in attendance at the last National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic in Indianapolis in 1949. At the time, Camp 15 had a fife and drum corps and Dave was a member. Their leader was John Runkle, who was a Past Commander in Chief and the face of the Sons of Union Veterans in Harrisburg for many years. Dave said that at one point Runkle gathered the boys from their rooms in the hotel and said "We're going downstairs to play for the old man". The old man who they played for, and gave a drum so he could accompany them, was Albert Woolson, the last surviving member of the GAR and the Union Army who died in 1956 at the age of 106. This represents just one of the incredible stories that Dave Klinepeter has shared over the years. "
