47th Regiment Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry

Dear Brothers of Hartranft Camp 15,

My cousins and I just attended the 150th Commemoration of the Battle of Cedar Creek, VA in which my distant cousin (Joseph Stephens) was killed and my distant great uncle (Samuel Remaly) wounded but survived - both with the 47th PA Infantry Regiment. I believe the 47th was composed of men from areas throughout Eastern Pennsylvania, stretching from Harrisburg to the L e h i g h V a l l e y

While there, we stopped at Hupp's Hill Museum where I purchased a DVD entitled "The Battle of Cedar Creek" by Civil War Videos (Civilwarvideos.com). When addressing the composition of Thomas's 2nd Brigade (1st Division, XIXth Corps) the narrator referred to the 8th

Vermont, the 12th Connecticut and the 120th New York......but totally omitted Thomas' fourth -- and possibly largest regiment -- THE 47TH PA, which formed his extreme right flank. As 8th Corps troops fled through its lines as the 47th got into position, the Rebs under Kershaw and Gordon launched their initial attack through the fog. The 47th put up a desperate fight but was pinned down in the Y-shaped ravine south of the 8th Vermont monument and overrun, sustaining 50-75% casualties. I feel that something should be done about erecting a monument there to the 47th pa so that their sacrifice shall never again be forgotten!

I'd appreciate any consideration and comment that any of my SUVCW brothers can provide as to how to best address this concern.

Prior to meeting, SVC Smith appointed Brothers in the audience to perform the duties of the officers not in attendance.

The meeting was called to order by Senior Vice Commander Jeffrey Smith at 2:15 PM.

The Minutes from September 21, 2014 were read by Tony Kline in the absence of Secretary Gregory Kline. Motion to approve by David Demmy, Sr. and seconded by Robert Treat. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was discussed by Treasurer David Demmy, Sr. "Funds available for

expenditures is \$683". Motion to accept by Robert Treat and seconded by Kevin Williams. Motion carried. Bookkeeping available upon request!

Orders, Communications and Bills:

Tony Kline read correspondence from the PA Department and National which included the following:

PA Department Order #6 informing the Department of the passing of Camp Commander Carl Bowers of Washington Camp #120.

National General Order #5 ordering the suspension of Col. Edward D. Baker Camp #6, Camp-at Large in Oregon and the suspension of the Department of Iowa and the Department of Kentucky.

Old Business

- 1) SVC Jeffery Smith reminded the Members that Camp #15 will be staffing a recruiting table at the Gettysburg Antique Show at the Eisenhower Convention Center on Saturday, October 25 from 9-5 and Sunday, October 26 from 9-2. Camp #15 volunteers are encouraged to attend.
- 2) Regarding the Adopt-A-Position at the Gettysburg Battlefield, SVC Jeffrey Smith reported that we will need to select a position on the battlefield and maintain it semi-annually, once in the Spring and once in the Fall. He suggests we might want to select a Pennsylvania Battery location because some of our active members reenact with a battery. He suggests Knaps Battery on Culps Hill and Powers Hill. Brother Jeff will meet with Brother Greg Kline and decide on a location and to probably set a first clean-up date for Spring 2015. All Camp #15 Brothers are invited to volunteer.

New Business:

1) We received a request from Andrew Adam a Boy Scout from Mechanicsburg and his mother Anita asking for a donation to help support Andrew's Eagle Scout project. He is planning to erect monument commemorating a Civil War drummer boy and a sketch of the proposed project was shown at our meeting. He wanted to place the monument on the grounds of the National Civil War Museum, at Reservoir Park, but city officials rejected his request! David Demmy, Sr. remarked due to the high estimates of the cost project, Hartranft Camp could initiate an application to the national committee on monuments who may grant a donation in favor of young Andrew's project. It was decided to have Brother Logan Swanger, our Eagle coordinator, talk to the scout to maybe consider a different location! The Heroes Grove in Lower Paxton Township may be an excellent site for a civil war hero drummer boy monument! Otherwise. Mechanicsburg may become best choice!

As part of *Wreaths Across America*, Camp #15 has been asked to participate, in a ceremony to be held at the State Capitol Rotunda on Monday, December 8, 2014 at noon. We have been asked to lay a wreath and say a few words. SVC Jeffrey Smith said that he, Commander Scott Debo and Secretary Gregory Kline have indicated they may possibly attend. More volunteers would be helpful and you should let Jeff know if you plan to attend.

<u>PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN</u> by Dave Klinepeter

In the fall of 1864 President Lincoln was running for a second term, his opponent was General George McClellan whose party was talking about making peace with the Confederates. Following is a poem from a fall issue of Harpers Weekly in 1864.

THE SITUATION

Slow fades the summer in the leaf, With steady pace the autumn comes, And still our throbbing pulses time With bugle-note and roll of drums.

Still waves our starry flag on high It's greeting to the broad blue dome, And still we gather 'neath its folds In spite of treacherous foes at home.

We heed no offerings of a Peace
That clouds the honor of our land;
Our Hands will never yield the sword
Till firmly based the Right shall stand.

The giant cataract echoed loud
The calm reply our ruler gave:
"Restore the Union of the States

And loose the fetters of the slave!"

Ah, not till then may battle cease

Though thick the rain of blood and tears;

This sacred baptism of fire

Must purify the stains of years.

It was by blood the land was bought,
The precious blood which patriots give
To win the birth-right of mankind;
It is through the blood that we shall live.

As Abraham, known in days of old, Offered up Isaac in God's eyes; Our land, the mother of us all, Offers her sons a Sacrifice.

On Southern slopes their graves are green, No war dreams stir their tranquil sleep; Theirs is a rest forever sealed, Whether the Nation smile or weep.

Oh, let it not be all in vain

That these have died! The smoke-stained sky
Is ringing with the cry of "Peace!"

And men proclaim the end is nigh.

Oh, God of battles, hear our prayer Above this wild and stormy din, And grant that ere the leaves shall fall Freedom and Peace be ushered in!

(President Lincoln did win a second term)

November 11, 1865 Closing of Camp Curtin in Harrisburg, Pa.

"The field upon which we now stand will be known as classic ground, for here has been the great center point of the organization of our military forces. When my administration of public affairs will have forgotten and the good and evil will be only known to the investigation of antiquarian, Camp Curtin, with its memories and associations, will be immortal."

Governor Andrew Curtin's comments to a group of returning veterans in November 1865.

November 11, 1918 End of WW I

1863 President Lincoln, by Proclamation, set as side the last Thursday of November as a day of "Thanksgiving and Praise."
