The meeting was called to order by Camp Commander Scott Debo at 2:10 PM

The meeting minutes from May 2013, submitted by Brother Tony Kline acting for Secretary Greg Kline were read by Secretary Greg Kline. Motion to accept by Brother Tom Bowman, second by Brother Tony Kline, approved.

Treasurer's report by Brother David Demmy, Sr. The checkbook balance stands at \$2,221, which includes \$1,000 transferred from savings to the checking account to avoid \$12 monthly financial institute penalty if our balance should fall under \$1,000. Motion to accept by Brother Tony Kline, second by Brother Dave Klinepeter, approved.

Brother Greg Kline reported on the condition of Department Secretary Charlie Kuhn who will be undergoing surgery to treat cancer of the kidney. Our thoughts and prayers are with Charlie.

New Member applications were read for Thomas Fortuna of Mechanicsburg and John Shemwell (Junior application) also of Mechanicsburg. Motion by Brother Dave Demmy, Sr, seconded by Brother Tom Bowman to have the Secretary cast a single unanimous ballot on behalf of the candidates. Motion approved.

Brother Tom Fortuna, being present at the meeting, was installed as a Member of Camp 15 by Commander Debo.

Old Business:

JVC Jeff Smith is making contact with organizers of the Gettysburg Gun Show regarding a possible recruiting table for Camp 15 at the event. This will be held in late October or early November and volunteers will be needed to help staff it.

New Business:

- Secretary Greg Kline will work on drawing up a permission form to allow a Camp 15 Member the ability to act "in loco parentis" on behalf of a Junior Member or Associate participating in Camp 15 meetings or activities in the absence of a parent. A similar form used by Cooper's Battery B will be used as a guideline. Additional issues and questions relating to Juniors were discussed.
- 2. Brother Greg Kline discussed the possibility of a joint field trip between Camp 15 and Camp 503 of Sunbury to Arlington National Cemetery on March 29, 2014. The date is tentative until plans can be finalized and Members expressed an interest in keeping it simple, focusing only on Arlington and the World War II monument with a dinner stop on the way home. Brother Kline is working out details with Wolf's Bus Company.
- 3. JVC Jeff Smith announced that he will offer a program on Pickett's Charge at the next Camp 15 meeting.



PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN

THE MEMORIAL TO GENERAL GORDON MEADE IN WASHINGTON D.C. Prepared under the direction of the Meade Memorial Commission of Pennsylvania, October 19, 1927



Not since General Meade rode down Pennsylvania Avenue, at the head of the Grand Army of the Potomac, sixty two years ago, victor in the greatest battle of the Civil War and the commander of the army that saved the nation and Washington, an imposing citv impressive of ceremonies, view a more inspiring public function than the dedication of the

Meade Memorial. Beautiful surroundings, flags, decorations, soldiers, sailors, veterans, ambassadors, high officials. The Governor of Penna, the President of the United States lent color and importance to the event. But there was something above and beyond this mere physical background that gripped the hearts of thousands of men and women who gathered to pay homage to the Hero of Gettysburg.

Pennsylvanians Governor, his Cabinet and his Military Staff were accompanied by twenty nine direct descendants of General Meade, the members of the Pennsylvania Meade Memorial Commission and several hundred veterans of the Civil War. Preceding the dedication the Pennsylvania officials and their guests were tendered a reception by President and Mrs. Coolidge in the White House.

Escorted by a troop of Cavalry, the entire party proceeded to the site of the Memorial in the Botanic Garden, near Third Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, Northwest.

There, upon a covered stand on the south and facing the monument, the exercises were held. Over this stand were placed two flag poles, upon which the President's colors were raised the minute he stepped onto the platform. On the other side of the President's box, were the Governor (Fisher) and guests were seated. were placed the State flag of Pennsylvania and the Governor's flag. On the reading desk in front of the President's stand a large copy in oil of the coat-of-arms of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was placed in a wreath

and draped with laurel garlands. On the granite platform immediately in front of the President's stand were the color bearers of the G.A.R. who had many Civil War flags. On the seven upright front posts which supported the roof over the President's stand were placed seven hand-painted shields with a wreath of laurel garland. Each one bore the name of a corps commander who served with and under General Meade, as follows: Major General Reynolds, First Corps, Major General Hancock, Second Corps, Major General Sickles, Third Corps, Major General Sykes Fifth Corps, Major General Sedgwick, Sixth Corps, Major General Howard, Eleventh Corps, and Major General Slocum, Twelfth Corps.


Immediately over the shields and across the wreaths were placed small shields in the form of a keystone with the emblem of each corps painted in color upon them. Two flags were draped on each side of each of these shields and one waving out from a flag pole over each one, indication present remembrance. On each row of supports under this stand were placed smaller flags, smaller shields and laurel rope garland. Out around the four sides of the platform was a hand rail carrying flagpoles, U. S. flags, shields and laurel rope garland. and over each shield and each wreaths placed a small keystone in color with the word "Meade" in blue and "Pennsylvania" in red. On either side of the Memorial were placed larger masts or flagpoles which carried a horizontal steel wire over the Memorial. The center of the steel wire was attached to two white sheets which entirely enveloped the monument. On this steel wire were hung flags of the international code which spelled out the words"Battle of Gettysburg". One double stand directly over the hero's head, and draped in the back spelled "Major General Meade". On each mast were flags with the year "1863" on one side and on the other "1927". On top of each mast over all were flying American flags of the present day. The entire effect was beautiful and inspiring and gave a thrilling touch of color to the scene... The decorations were designed and executed by Frederick Owen, a veteran attached to the office of Lieut. Col U.S.A. Grant 3rd, who was executive officer of the Meade Memorial National Commission.

When the President and Governor and accompanying guests had been seated, Hon. Simon Fess, United States Senator from Ohio called the assembly to order. The Rev. Hugh Fulton, chaplain of the Reserve Corps gave the invocation, following which Governor Fisher, on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, presented the Memorial to the National Government. The Memorial was unveiled by Miss Henrietta Meade, of Philadelphia, the only surviving child of General Meade. She was a little girl of ten when the Battle of Gettysburg was fought. As Colonel Grant escorted Miss Meade to the statue, she stood in front of a Guard of Honor and Color Bearers of the Society of the Army of the Potomac, men from many states who had fought at Gettysburg with her father. Twenty veterans formed the Guard of Honor; and seven were color bearers, each carrying the colors of a corps.

When Miss Meade pulled the cord which was to release the great canvas sheets covering the statue, two of the veterans opened out the draperies right and left, showing the full figure of the general in uniform, extremely lifelike, as if he were just emerging from his headquarters tent. When the Memorial came into view, a salute of 13 guns was fired by Battery A, 16th Field Artillery, from Fort Myer, Va. which was stationed near by. Than occurred one of the most striking incidents of the dedication. The smoke from the guns flew directly in front of the statue, curling around the figure of General Meade as though it were a wreath of War enfolding his body in fond embrace. When the Memorial was fully exposed to view, two flags were hoisted aloft, one east, one west. One flag was specially made for this occasion with only 35 stars, representing the flag of the period of 1863. The other flag, nearest the Capital, had the full 48 stars of the present day. 48 pigeons, representing peace, were released at the base of the statue, which they circled three times and then set out for home. This made a fitting background for the address of President Coolidge who gave the great Pennsylvanian a glowing tribute in accepting the Memorial for the people of the nation.



AT THE MOMENT OF THE UNVEILING

A touch of sadness was thrown over the dedication when Mr. H. H. Spayd, Past Commander, Dept of Penna G.A.R. was stricken while delivering an address, immediately following the President. Mr Spayd, who was in his eighty third year, was a color bearer at the Battle of Gettysburg. He began in a vigorous fashion, and his fine full voice could be heard in the farthest edge of the crowd. Than it began to get weaker and weaker, and finally he could not speak at all. Army doctors present gave him immediate attention and removed him to an army hospital, where he passed away the following day. After the presentation of the sculptor and architects the exercises were brought to a close with a most beautiful and impressive prayer by the Rev. Dr. Pershing, Chaplin Dept of Penna G.A.R. (See picture above)

The figure in front is of General George Meade, a figure of war on the proper back. He is surrounded by six figures standing side by side. The six figures, all allegorical representations of Loyalty, Chivalry, Fame, Progress, Military Courage and Energy, were used by Grafly to show what he believed are traits needed to make a "great general".

To Meade's proper right is a male figure of Loyalty, and to his proper left is a female figure of Chivalry, who is

shown removing Mead's cloak, which symbolizes the "cloak of battle". Above Meade's head Loyalty holds a wreath and garland representing the general's deeds. Behind Loyalty stands a female figure of Fame' who is supported by the male figure of Energy. Behind the figure of Chivalry is the male figure of Progress and behind him a male figure of Military Courage, who is locked arms with War, Winged War is flanked by two memorial tablets. At the top of the monument is a gold finial with the state seal of Penna. ---- Described by Rosita Lee.

Pension Numerical Index, 1860-1934 at

www.form3.com

The <u>Civil War and Later Veterans Pension Index</u>, one of **Fold3**'s earliest titles, now has a partner in the recently added <u>Pension Numerical Index</u>. Officially called A1158, *Numerical Index to Pensions, 1860-1934*, this card index from the National Archives is a great cross-referencing tool as it covers pension application and certificate numbers for men who fought in wars prior to, during, or after the Civil War.

The cards are presented in numerical order, yet every card is indexed by name as well. The Pension Numerical Index can be used in tandem with other records on Fold3 like the Civil War and Later Veterans Pension Index (T289), and pension files for Revolutionary War, War of 1812, and Civil War. Imagine the long history of American military service indexed via the extremely large number of pensioners

recorded on these cards. If a serviceman's story isn't available yet on Fold3 within its extensive sets of military pension files, you can use the information on the Pension Numerical Index to order files from NARA.


