





A message from Brother Bill Jackson, correspondent for the Hummelstown Sun

Spent last Saturday afternoon with Pennsylvania Governor Andrew Gregg Curtin, originally from Bellefonte. No, not really, but with my friend David J. Klinepeter of Harrisburg who has been portraying Pennsylvania's Civil War governor for the past 25 years.

The occasion was a celebration of Dave's 75 years of service to the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. Our local Gen. John F. Hartranft Camp 15 of that organization honored Dave with a reception and luncheon at the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg.

Dave's membership application date reads July 9, 1943, when at age 18, he joined Camp 15 and its fife and drum corps. Since that time, with a couple of years off in the Navy during WWII, he has been a near constant reminder of the debt we owe to Union veterans for preserving our country. He has attended our meetings and encouraged our Hershey Civil War Round Table practically since we started it in 1991.

Dave is moving to the western part of the state to be near his son and grandchildren. However, we do expect to continue to see him in the personage of Governor Curtin at major Civil War events.
