<u>News</u> from recent 2018 National Encampment/Convention at Framingham, MA.

The 2019, event will be held in Cleveland Ohio, August 7 thru 11, at the DoubleTree by Hilton, located in Independence Ohio. \$114 per nite.

For 2020, the event will be held at Marriott Buckhead in Atlanta Georgia, August 8 thru 16 at rate of \$115 per nite. Come early to take in a *Braves* Game while in the region.

For 2021, our National Encampment Site Committee is considering a proposal by the Mid-West Department of Missouri to host the annual Allied Orders of the GAR's convention.


Remembrance Day headquarters at Eisenhower facility will end with the completion of Remembrance Day 2018 on 11/18/18. *The Committee has entered into a 4-year contract with the Wyndham at Gettysburg, again;* with rates, beginning with 2019 at \$129 thru 2021 at \$144.

A recommendation to grant Nephews and Nieces of first generation of a Civil War Veteran as Real Nephews and Real Nieces was ruled "out of order". Therefore, only first-generation sons of civil war veterans will continue to be known as **Real Sons** by the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.

Networking will be next project for more efficient data entry of adds, changes, and deletions to our National Database, which feeds the *Banner* mailing list each quarter. It is with a saddened heart and deep regret that I report the passing of our Brother **Donald M. Fry** of Linglestown, PA.

Brother Don was born May 17, 1932 at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania and departed this life on June 23, 2018 at Vero Beach, Florida. Brother Don is survived by his wife of 64 years, Dawn, daughter Pamela, and sons Brian and Larry.

Brother Don began his life long career with Bell Telephone as a teenager before serving with the US Navy during the Korean War era 1952-1956. Following his assignments on USS Bennington and USS Gilmore, he returned to Bell and retired in the Transportation and Safety areas. Don was a member of American Legon Post 272.

In additional to being a military veteran, Brother Don was an Eagle Scout and a dedicated Boy Scout Leader for most of his life. He served on local BSA council for 47 years earning the Silver Beaver Award in 1990. Since, June 1999, Don was a member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, he was Camp 15's Eagle Scout Coordinator for most of his membership in Camp 15. He based his right of membership in the Son's upon his linage to his Great-Grandfather, Levi Charles Fry who served with the 87th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry and later with the 166th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry till the duration of America's Civil War 1861-1865.

As Commander, I am requesting that all membership badges and camp newsletter be draped in black from July 1, 2018 until August 31, 2018 in remembrance of Brother Donald Fry.

It is with a saddened heart and deep regret that I report the passing of our Brother Lester [Les] McClure of uptown Harrisburg, PA.

Brother Les, while a relatively new member to Camp 15 in recent years, was dedicated to our cause and purpose for our being, a patriotic hereditary organization, to keep alive the memory of the men in Blue of this Nation's Civil War of 1861 - 1865, those men that kept our great nation whole.

Les was a grand master mechanic for the City of Harrisburg Bureau of Fire. Among his other memberships were, American Legion; Midget Baseball Association; and local volunteer Fire Departments and of course, the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.

Upon returning home as a veteran of the US Navy, Les began as best we know in 1946 to begin to obtain American Flags and place them upon the gravesites of all veterans laid to rest at historic Harrisburg Cemetery.

When Camp 15 was revived in the late years of 1998-1999, Les invited our other WWII veteran, David R Klinepeter to include the camp with his annual project of placing flags at Harrisburg Cemetery during Memorial Day weekend; and so, since that time, Camp 15 has honorably and proudly joined Les and his family, each year to place flags upon the veterans at Harrisburg Cemetery!

As Commander, I am requesting that all membership badges and camp newsletter be draped in black for the remainder of the summer of 2018 in remembrance of Brother Les McClure and for his military service and his honor to the deceased veterans lying in Harrisburg Cemetery.



HISTORIC PEACE CHURCH

Peace Church, located at the corner of St. John's Church Road and Trindle Road, is a simple church of worship built at the end of the 18th century. The cornerstone was laid on June 12, 1798 and it was dedicated in May of 1799. In 1807, a pipe organ was purchased from Conrad Doll of Lancaster and is still in use today. The church has been owned by the PA Historical and Museum Commission since 1969 and has been operated by the Friends of Peace Church since 1972. Membership is open to the public (\$15 person, \$10 seniors, \$25 sponsors). The mailing address is Friends of Peace Church, PO Box 3034, Shiremanstown, PA 17011. In 1972, Peace Church entered the National Registry of Historic Places. From June through September, programs are held on Sundays at 3 pm.

In 1863, the Civil War was raging. The southern part of the United States was hit hard with numerous bloody battles. Meanwhile, Hampden Township was a small farming community and Peace Church was a serene gathering place for many of them. Harrisburg was the capitol of the 2nd largest state in the union and an important supply and logistics center for the northern armies. Tens of thousands of new recruits were mustered into service and drilled in camps around the city. General Robert E. Lee decided to attack Harrisburg to cut the supply lines and drive the horrors of war to the north. Two Confederate divisions moved into Cumberland County in June, A third division was to attack Harrisburg from the rear. The Union forces set up a defense line near present day Camp Hill, Confederate General Albert Jenkins, after moving through Mechanicsburg, set up cannons on the Peace Church grounds and fired almost continuously for 48 hours. Lee gave the order for the attack to proceed - but later that evening learned that the Army of the Potomac had moved closer than he thought - so he sent new orders for all units to gather at Cashtown - near Gettysburg. Jenkins pulled out of Peace Church on June 30th leaving two cavalry units behind. They ended up in a fire fight with Union forces at Sporting Hill - the northernmost skirmish of the Civil War.

So the battle was moved to Gettysburg - and peace was returned to Peace Church.
