



Snowfall at GAP! Fort Indiantown GAP!

March 1928 – 26 inches of snow accumulated *during* the month of March 1928; most of it fell heavy and wet the night of the 17^{th} into the 18^{th} .

It was the heaviest 24-hour snow fall in 37 years of record keeping. <u>Downtown Harrisburg received 15</u>" of snow itself. Note: A man's suit could be purchased at Doutrich's Clothiers for \$28.00. The original Harrisburg Senators opened the 1928 season with a win over the Williamsport Grays in the New York-Penn League at Island Park. A fishing license in 1928 cost a mere \$1.50 and pork chops sold for 27 cents a pound; more than an Easter ham that sold for 20 cents a pound in 1928!




Hartranft Born in December

Hartranft, John Frederick (1830-1889) — Born in New Hanover Township, <u>Montgomery County</u>, Pa., <u>December 16, 1830</u>. A Republican, he served in the Union Army during the Civil War; was <u>Pennsylvania</u> state auditor general, 1866-72; then <u>Governor of</u> <u>Pennsylvania</u>, 1873-79; and candidate for Republican nomination for President, <u>1876</u>. He received the <u>Medal</u> <u>of Honor</u> in 1886 for action at Bull Run, Va., July 21, 1861. The General died <u>October 17, 1889</u>. His Interment is at <u>Montgomery Cemetery</u>, Norristown, PA, which Camp 15 has visited. The General, of course, is our Camp's namesake!






